Optional Camp Swim Lessons offer our campers a "cool" way to learn and stay fit this summer! With the assistance of friendly, certified instructors, our campers can feel comfortable in social situations at the pool, learn new skills, and improve swim strokes. Your child will practice safety in our on-site, aquatic environment!

^{*}Weekly payments are due on the first day of the week by 9:00am. After 6:00pm on the second day, a \$25 late payment fee will be assessed and your child's registration will be blocked.
