Their answers are right! Everyone has their own way of saying what respect means.




Recess

"I have an older sister, Meghan and a younger brother, Kevin."


What do you like to do outside of school?

We talked to all the kids, and we asked them all their favorite candies. The most liked candy in the school is . . . Candy Corn by one vote!


Movie Night
