



Way to go Arman!!!

Arman Patel's (Jr Kindergarten, Mrs. Hannan) swim lessons journey began January 2013 at the Spring Valley YMCA in Roversford, PA. Arman has been taking swim lessons all year round between the Spring Valley and Pottstown YMCA locations. In spring, summer and fall, Arman attended 2 to 3 nights of swim lessons (30 minutes per lessons). In the winter, he did Saturday only swim lessons. In the month of September 2014, he passed the "Orange Wristband" test at the Pottstown YMCA! To earn the YMCA "Orange Wristband" - "swimmers must be able to swim 10 yards in the pool with front float, with back float and stand. This allows a child 6-13 to be in shallow water without parent (parent must be on deck)."

Arman worked very hard to earn this certification. His family and friends are so very proud of Arman for this awesome accomplishment and for not stopping here... Arman is currently working towards obtaining the next level the "Green Wristband."


