WEEK IN REVIEW

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

This week in ELA we reviewed how to find main idea and details in text. Our small groups have been working on: compare & contrast and point of view; similes, singular to plural, and suffixes; prefixes and word parts; beginning sounds and vowels. We also celebrated Outdoor Classroom Day by taking our reading outdoors!



Next week we will be working on the following objectives as a class and in small groups (small groups will work on these objectives at differentiated levels):

- 1. Describing characters, settings, and major events in a story, using key details.
- 2. Writing informative/explanatory texts in which they name a topic, supply some facts about the topic, and provide some sense of closure (writing friendly letters).
- 3. Recognizing and reading grade-appropriate irregularly spelled words and with guidance and support from adults (high frequency words); demonstrating understanding of word relationships and nuances in word meanings (vocabulary).
- 4. Knowing the spelling-sound correspondences for common consonant digraphs (sh and th).
- 5. Using common, proper, and possessive nouns

MATH

This week in math we worked on finding the unknown numbers and true/false equations. We also reviewed addition and subtraction concepts and made fact family turkeys!



Next week we will be working on the following objectives as a class and in small groups (small groups will be working on these objectives at different levels):

- 1. I can fill in the missing number in equations to make them true.
- 2. I can find different strategies to add three numbers.
- 3. I can use different strategies to solve word problems with three addends.
- 4. I can solve word problems involving comparisons.
- 5. I can understand the equal sign means "same value as".

SOCIAL STUDIES/SCIENCE

This week we continued our science unit on Plants by taking care of and observing our own plants. We also had a mock election on Election Day. The topic that we voted on is- should we get a fish as a class pet (yes) or (no). The votes are in and.... it was a unanimous win for "Yes" so we will have a new friend in our classroom on Monday!



Next week we will work on our Social Studies Unit-Important Documents with the following objectives:

- 1. Why was the Declaration of Independence written?
- 2. Why was the Constitution written?
- 3. What is the Bill of Rights?
