### WEEK IN REVIEW


#### **ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS**

This week in ELA we talked together about what it means to compare and contrast using a Venn diagram. We used our group read-aloud, "Fox & Kit", to compare and contrast a fox and another animal of our choice- cat! We also had small groups working on:

- compare & contrast and point of view / Word Work: er, ear, eer
- simile, singular to plural, suffixes / Word Work: o, oa, ow
- prefix "un" /Word work: o, o-e, oa
- beginning sounds and reading strategies / Word Work: Short i & Long i

Next week we will have small groups working on:

- parts of speech, simile, and subject-predicate / Word Work: ir, ire, ier
- · long vs. short words, verbs, sentence formation / Word Work: u, ew, ue
- compound words and contractions / Word Work: u, u-e, ui, oo
- vowels and syllables / Word Work: short o, long o



#### MATH

This week in math we worked on some word problem strategies such as underlining or circling important information, writing equations, and drawing pictures to help us solve the problem. The students have also been working on differentiated activities through their "First in Math" app. We also had small groups working on:

- addition and subtraction strategies to 20
- addition and subtraction strategies to 10

**Next week** we will be working on Topic 1 & 2 Addition & Subtraction assessment practice and taking our Topic 1 & 2 Addition & Subtraction assessment. We will also review counting on to add, counting on using an open number line, and doubles. Our small groups will build upon these concepts through:

- Enrichment activities
- Building Mathematical Literacy
- Review to Build Understanding








## SOCIAL STUDIES/ SCIENCE

This week in Social Studies we learned about the purpose and structure of government including the three branches of government: executive, legislative, and judicial. We also talked about the roles of a Mayor and Governor. We also celebrated Peace Day and created Peace banners to describe what peace means to us.

**Next week** we will connect Social Studies and English Language Arts for a project based learning unit with the driving question: "How can students persuade others to make changes to the rules or laws in their school or community?"
