









Blended Learning - Station Rotation Model

General Parking Lot Rules





- Vehicle ignitions MUST be turned off and keys removed while parked on the school grounds.
- Children (including siblings) may not be left unattended in a vehicle at any time for any reason.

Morning Drop Off

- Drop Off Line 8:30-8:45 a.m. ONLY
- Mrs. Navarro will be present to help unload students in the drop off line
- Children who arrive prior to 8:30 a.m. must be walked into the building and signed in at the front desk.
- Children who arrive after 8:45 a.m. are marked tardy and will be held in the lobby until morning meeting is over. Tardy students must be walked in and signed in as well.

Afternoon Pick Up

- 3:45 p.m. at the west gate (weather permitting)
- Buses > Cars > Walk-ups
- Any changes to pick up schedules communicated to office prior to 3:00 p.m.
- Carpool sign hung from passenger side visor
- Parent pick-up inside the building permitted for
 - Early pick-ups (prior to 3:30) will be documented in attendance system
 - Students enrolled in after care
- Students not picked up by 4:00 p.m. will be sent to after care and will be charged \$30 drop-in after care fee.

Security

It is important that we maintain the highest level of security for our students. All exterior doors, except for the two main entrance doors to the school are locked during the school day.

All guests are buzzed in, asked to report to the office and signin.

Any parent who arrives on-site during school hours are asked to report to the front office. If a student is leaving early or you need to see or speak with your student during the school day, an administrator will pull the student from the classroom. It is our goal to minimize distractions within the learning environment.
