Important Summer Camp Reminders:

PRESCHOOL (Toddlers—Pre-K 1)

Please note the Toddler's through Pre-K age groups' summer activity fee is \$100 and will be billed the week of June 17th, if you are an ACH family, the withdraw will occur on June 17th.

Splash Days:

Children MUST come to school in their bathing suit and water shoes ready for Splash Day. Please provide a towel and a change of clothes.

Rising Kindergarteners (5+) - SCHOOL AGE

Please note that all rising Kindergarteners that are 5 years old and School Age groups' summer activity fee is \$225 and will be billed the week of June 17th, if you are an ACH family, the withdraw will occur on June 17th.

**Children going on off campus field trips: you MUST wear a Camp Zone t-shirt. We will keep the camp shirts at the school and wash them so everyone has them for their field trips.

Pool Day Field trips: Bathing suit, sunscreen, towel, and water shoes.

Other Field Trips: Appropriate walking shoes and other items as specified.

Please provide extra weather appropriate clothing and extra (close toed) shoes. You MUST label your child's belongings so they don't get mixed up with the other children's.

In addition, we ask that you apply sunscreen on your camper BEFORE they come to camp. Please note the importance of the morning application of sunscreen. The school will be providing and reapplying throughout the day. On field trips we will be providing the sunscreen unless your child requires a special sunscreen.

Important Reminders: CLOSED TOED SHOES

Please note the importance of sending your child to school in closed-toed shoes. There is a high risk of injury to a child's toe when toes are exposed. Thank you in advance for your attention to this matter.

Updated shot records and physicals are needed. Please remember that with any check-up we do require updated shot records and physical forms. Infants and Toddlers need updated shot records every six months.

TICK ALERT!

We are on high tick alert! Please be sure to check your child every night. Ticks are predicted to be worse than normal this year. Please let us know if you have questions about how to check your child.

If you would like bug spray to be applied to your child before going outside, please provide with the appropriate form filled out from the front desk.

Vacation Reminder

Heading out of town on vacation? Families who have been enrolled for at least six months get one-week vacation tuition credit per our fiscal year (July-June). For any vacation, please let the front office know if you are planning on using your vacation time. Two weeks' written notice (emails okay) are required to use a vacation credit.

Recipe of the Month: Frozen Banana Bites



Ingredients

- 1 cup peanut butter (or peanut butter substitute)
- 4 bananas, sliced into 1-inch rounds
- 8 (1 ounce) squares semisweet chocolate
- 1 tablespoon shortening 1/3 cup toffee baking bits

Directions

- 1. Cover a baking sheet with waxed paper.
- 2. Spoon a thin layer of peanut butter on top of each banana slice. Insert a toothpick through the peanut butter layer into the banana. Place banana bites onto the prepared baking sheet; freeze for 30 minutes to overnight.
- 3. Melt chocolate and shortening in the top of a double boiler over simmering water, stirring frequently and scraping down the sides with a rubber spatula to avoid scorching.
- 4. Cover another baking sheet with waxed paper.
- 5. Remove 2 to 4 banana bites from the freezer at a time; coat each bite with chocolate mixture. Place coated banana bites on the second baking sheet; sprinkle each with toffee bits. Repeat until all the bites are coated. Return banana bites to freezer until set, at least 1 hour. Allow bites to sit in room temperature for about 15 minutes before serving.

**You can use anything you want in place of the toffee: sprinkles, nuts, cookie crumbs, or whatever! This is also really good with dark chocolate

Splish Splash! Fun Water Play Activities for Preschoolers

The summer months are a great time for children of all ages to splash and explore with water. Not only is water play fun, but it's also a great learning experience for your child. Supervised water play fosters creativity, fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, language skills, math and science concepts, and so much more.

Below are four of our favorite activities to try with your little one.

1. Paint with Water

Painting with water is an easy, mess-free activity that will stimulate your child's imagination. Give him paintbrushes, rollers and a bucket of water. Let him paint the house or driveway and watch the water disappear in the heat.

2. Water Sounds

Provide your child with spoons and a few mason jars, each filled with a different amount of water and a different food coloring. Encourage him to tap the spoons against the jars to hear the various sounds. Ask, "What happens when you tap the jar in different spots?" or "How would you describe that jar of water?" Listen for vocabulary related to size, color and sound.

3. Wash Toys

Children love doing "grown-up" jobs, so enlist his help in cleaning his toys! Fill a bucket with soapy water and a few sponges. Encourage him to gather plastic dolls, cars or figurines and wash them in the water. Show him how to clean each toy and place them on a clean towel to dry.

4. Cause & Effect Experiment

Bring a few ice cubes outside and watch them melt in the sunshine. Ask your child questions that encourage exploration and guide critical thinking, such as "What do you think will happen when we put the ice cube in the sun?", "How long do you think it will take for the
