

## Face Coverings

- All staff will wear face coverings inside the building and at times when social distancing is not possible (ie: first aid).
- **Campers in PK and up:** Face coverings are required inside, except when eating. Face coverings are not required outside.
- Face coverings will not be worn during exercise, or by anyone who has trouble breathing or is unable to remove the face covering without assistance.

## Health Checks

We screen temperatures of staff and children and anyone with a temperature over 100.4 degrees is not permitted to enter the facility. If a child becomes ill during the day, they will stay in a separate area while awaiting pickup. Children may return to camp after they have been fever free for 24 hours.

## Safe Distancing

Staff members are the only adults permitted to enter the building. Pick up and drop off take place outside the facility. Seating areas are spaced a minimum of 6 feet apart and swimming and field trips are suspended.

## Meals

- **All campers should bring a lunch from home every day** Campers will eat lunch in their bunks, or outside, weather permitting.
- **Summer Camp is a NUT FREE zone!**
- Please provide a healthy morning snack each day. A prepackaged afternoon snack will be provided.

## Sanitation

We will continue our focus on hand-washing and disinfecting throughout the day.

## Summer Camp Team

All counselors will complete a health survey upon arrival each day. This includes a temperature check. Temperatures must be below 100.4 in order for counselors to remain at camp. Counselors will be trained extensively in all new policies and procedures including extra cleaning measures.

## Cleaning & disinfecting

In addition to the health and safety measures mentioned above, we will implement regular cleaning that includes, but is not limited to, disinfecting high touch areas and frequently used spaces. We will limit shared items and will disinfect these items between use. Cleaning and disinfecting will be conducted multiple times a day. We will also have our janitorial crew complete deep cleaning and disinfecting each night.

## Drop-off and Pick-up

### Drop off:

- Drop off will take place out front.
- Campers and 1 parent/guardian will walk up to check in at the indicated table (Campers entering PK, K & 1st Grade at the front entrance; Campers entering 2nd Grade & up at the side entrance. If you have a camper in both age groups, check in at the front entrance).
- On your campers first day of camp, camper and parent/guardian photos will be taken for their Tadpoles profile. This will help us safely identify authorized pick ups.
- Campers will have their temperature taken each day. If their temperature is 100.4 or higher, they will not be permitted to stay.
- Parents/guardians will complete a quick health survey each day a camper is not at camp the prior day (Every Monday and whenever there is time between camp days; ie: Monday, Wednesday, Friday). The survey is digital and you will be asked to scan a QR code with a personal device. Campers exhibiting two or more symptoms will not be able to attend camp.
- After campers have passed the health screening, a staff member will walk campers to their rooms. Campers will wash their hands before participating in camp activities.

### Pick up

- Pick up will take place at the front entrance of the camp between 3:30 and 5:30pm.
- Please park, and check in at the pick up table. A member of the camp team will bring your camper out to you.
- If you need to pick up before 3:30pm, please call 610-719-0240 to set up a pick up time.
- Parents/guardians should carry identification.

Camp staff working drop off and pick up will wear facial coverings and gloves. It is recommended that parents/guardians wear facial coverings as well.

## Sunscreen

- **Every camper must have sunscreen applied before arriving at camp in the morning.**
- Every camper must bring their own sunscreen to camp on a daily basis. Spray bottles are recommended. The bottle must be clearly labeled.
- Camp staff will direct campers to re-apply sunscreen before lunch and late afternoon.
- **Please help us prepare campers by teaching them how to apply their own sunscreen. Counselors will monitor sunscreen application closely, and assist campers, if needed, practicing appropriate health and safety procedures.**
- Hats and/or sunglasses are suggested.
- Shirts must be worn at all times (even during water play activities).

## Water

- **Water bottles are not permitted at camp.**
- Campers will have access to water throughout the entire camp day. It will be distributed in disposable cups.

## Field Trips

We will not be attending in-person field trips during the summer. Instead, we will participate in virtual field trips to area attractions as well as far off places!

## Group Sizes

Group sizes will be limited in order to maintain social distancing. Campers will remain with the same group throughout the week. It is our goal to use our large outdoor area as much as possible, throughout the summer.

Campers will be assigned 1 primary counselor. At the beginning of each week, we will communicate who the primary counselor is for each group. We have identified a select number of camp team members that will rotate in and out of the groups.

**Due to this factor, we anticipate having to cut off registration during certain weeks throughout the summer. Please make sure your weekly selection form is complete.**

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
