## **Links to Home: Shared Activities for Parents & Children**

This month, your child will retell stories including the main characters and events, build subtraction skills, and use a journal to communicate her thoughts and ideas.

Here are some suggested activities to practice these skills with your child:

- Ask your child to "read" a familiar book aloud to you. See if she can tell the story in proper sequence and with relevant detail.
- Place five socks in front of your child. Ask her to count how many socks she sees. Take a few socks away and have her recount them. Repeat the activity by varying the number of socks that you remove.
- Start a journal with your child. Have her draw a picture of something that happened during the day. Next to the picture, have her try to write some words that relate to it. Inventive spelling is appropriate at this age.
