

FEBRUARY INTERMEDIATES

Links to Home: Shared Activities for Parents & Children

This month, your child will learn to count to 30, recognize numbers 1-10, and identify animals and their habitats.

Here are some suggested activities to practice these skills with your child.

- Name an animal and ask your child where that animal lives.
 "Where do lions live?" or "Where do fish live?" Reverse the question by asking, "What animals live in the zoo?" or "What animals live in the ocean?"
- Provide your child with a stack of index cards and mini stickers. Help your child write the numbers 1 to 10 on the left half of the cards. Ask your child to place the correct number of stickers to the right side of each card.
- Ask your child to look for items in your house that have numbers on them; for example, telephones, remote controls and calendars. Point to a number and see if your child can identify it.
