 Uses a journal as a way to communicate ideas and thoughts through writing and drawing Uses inventive spelling in writing Writes all uppercase and lowercase letters of the alphabet Writes first and last name in proper case Writes numerals 1–100 with support 	 Science and Social Studies SCIENCE Makes predictions based on prior knowledge Explores how gears turn inside a clock Explores various tools used to count (calculator, beads, abacus) Understands the concept of magnetism and makes predictions
