

<ul> <li>Pushes and pulls toys while walking</li> <li>Throws a ball forward</li> <li>Sits in a child-sized chair</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Imitates familiar adult behavior, particularly "helper" and "clean-up" behaviors</li> <li>Pretends to be familiar animals</li> </ul>

<ul><li>Puts items into a container</li><li>Turns over small containers to find objects</li></ul>	Self-Help Skills
<ul> <li>Pushes button to produce an effect (for example, pop-up toy)</li> <li>Stacks a tower of two to three blocks</li> <li>Pulls apart pop beads</li> <li>Points with index finger</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Helps to dress and undress self</li> <li>Feeds self independently with hands</li> <li>Attempts to feed self with spoon</li> <li>Points to self when named</li> <li>Takes off socks and shoes</li> </ul>
Health, Safety and Nutrition	Social Interaction
<ul> <li>Eats a variety of table foods</li> <li>Stops in response to "no"</li> <li>Sleeps on a toddler-sized cot</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Assists in picking up toys</li> <li>Offers a toy when prompted</li> <li>Engages in parallel play</li> <li>Engages in multi-sensory activities</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Listens to a 5-minute story with pictures</li> </ul>	Self-Help Skills
<ul> <li>Responds to specific words in stories by showing what was named</li> <li>Turns pages in book</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Drinks from an open cup</li> <li>Feeds self with spoon</li> <li>Recognizes self in mirror</li> </ul>
123 Mathematics	<ul> <li>Shows preferences, likes and dislikes</li> <li>Retrieves personal items from cubby</li> </ul>
Numbers and Number Sense	Social Interaction
<ul><li>Begins to understand the number concept of one</li><li>Repeats numbers 1-5</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Briefly shares with others when prompted</li> <li>Engages in give and take play, such as rolling a ball back and forth</li> <li>Pays attention to other children</li> </ul>
Geometry and Relationships	
<ul> <li>Points to simple shapes</li> <li>Points to common colors</li> <li>Matches a picture of an object to an object</li> <li>Demonstrates an understanding of 'big' &amp; 'little'</li> </ul>

Gross Motor Skills and Balance <ul> <li>Jumps in place with two feet</li> <li>Runs</li> <li>Climbs steps independently</li> <li>Throws a ball forward</li> <li>Sits upright on floor with legs crisscrossed</li> <li>Fills and dumps containers</li> </ul>	
Fine Motor Skills	I
<ul> <li>Puts large pegs in a peg board</li> <li>Places blocks in a row</li> <li>Strings large beads</li> <li>Turns large knobs</li> <li>Builds a tower of 4 or more blocks</li> <li>Lifts lids from large containers</li> </ul>	
Health, Safety and Nutrition	I
<ul> <li>Climbs playground stairs holding the railing</li> <li>Sits and stands from child-sized chair without falling</li> </ul>
