- Share a new book with your child. Ask her to find and identify various parts of the book, such as the cover, title page and table of contents.
- Bake cookies with your child. Ask her to tell you the steps to take in order to get the task completed.

## COMMUNICATION

- Follows multi-step directions

## SELF-HELP SKILLS

- Follows naptime or quiet time routines
- Ties shoes with minimal support
- Eats meals/snacks within a predetermined time frame
- Maintains belongings in cubby
- Follows clean up routines
- Understands and follows basic table manners

- Says "excuse me" to interrupt conversation
- Begins to use patience when waiting to speak while adults are speaking
- Labels emotions in self and others
- Uses different techniques to manage peer conflict situations
- Interacts with others in classroom activities

## NUMBERS AND NUMBER SENSE

- Counts from 1-100 independently
- Counts by tens to 100

- Tells time from a digital clock


## GEOMETRY AND RELATIONSHIPS

- Describes a 5+ step procedure in sequential order (classroom routine, handwashing, etc.)
- Puts 5 objects in a series based on length
- Correctly names 2D and 3D shapes regardless of their size or orientation


## PROBLEM SOLVING AND REASONING

- Sorts pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters by appearance and value
- Creates and interprets a bar graph
- Explores calculators as a mathematical tool

## SCIENCE

- Gives examples of wants and needs
- Explores a variety of fabrics
- Explores parts of a plant
- Explores differences in flowers


## SOCIAL STUDIES

- Identifies different types of products sold at different types of stores
- Develops an awareness that different people provide help, goods, and services
- Recognizes the use of money as a means of exchange for goods and services
- Interprets simple timelines to explain changes over time

- Identifies common clothing worn within the family
