Links to Home: Shared Activities for Parents & Children

This month, your child will discuss major events in a story, learn about the metamorphosis of a caterpillar into a butterfly, and learn about the concept of speed.

Here are some suggested activities to practice these skills with your child.

- When you read to your child, ask questions about the main characters and key events in the story. Stop partway through the story and ask what your child thinks will happen next. Ask why she thinks that event will occur.
- Take a picture walk through The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle.
 Without reading the text, allow your child to look at the pictures and tell you what is happening on each page. Then read the book aloud to your child and discuss the story.
- Go for a walk with your child. Point out examples of speed or movement; for example, vehicles, animals and pedestrians. Ask your child to describe the object or person's speed.
