Beginner 1:

- Our Beginner friends are back from celebrating a wonderful Holiday season with their family and friends and are excited to welcome the New Year!
- HURRAY 2023 is upon us and we are looking forward to some fun learning experiences this month.
- Our theme for Week 1 is "It's Snowing". We will learn all the fun things we do outdoors when it snows and create Snow themed art. We will learn the rhyme "Five Little Snowflakes" and read the book "The Snowy Day" by Ezra Keats.
- Week 2 Winter is the perfect time to explore the world of Arctic Animals. This week we will learn about Penguins and their habitat. We will read the book "How do Penguins Play?"
- Week 3 On MLK day it is a great time to introduce our beginners to learn about Dr Martin Luther King Jr and will read the story The Story of Martin Luther King Jr by Johnny Ray Moore. We will talk about simple concepts of beauty in diversity, being inclusive and being nice to each other.
- In Week 4 Continuing to support a strong understanding of Diversity and Culture we will learn about Chinese New Year and the customs. We will make paper lanterns in our art project. We will read the book Peppa's Chinese New Year.
- Wishing you and your families a Warm, Happy and Healthy New Year!

Beginner 2:

- January 1st- Class Expectations! We will be going over all class rules this week as a refresher (sticky backs, bubbles, etc). We have new friends in B2 so this will help everyone know our class rules
- January 8th- Feeling Blue. We will be going over emotions and feelings. We will be reading a ton of books as well as doing feeling crafts.
- January 16th- Dinosaurs!! We will be learning about different Dinos, as well as singing different songs about Dinosaurs
- January 23th- Weather. We will be learning about different weather forecasts (rain, snow, sunny) and will talk about this with our daily weather person
- January 30th- Groundhog day! Students will learn about the PA based holiday! We will learn about groundhogs and make a groundhog craft:-)

Intermediates:

- ~Happy New Year~2023~

 This is a second of the second
 - This month we will talk about the New Years and our goals as a classroom for 2023
- The books we will be reading this month will have to do with different zoo animals. We will focus on getting to know many arctic animals including polar bears, owls, and foxes. We will be doing experiments with ice, we will explore the concept of sink and float.

- Next, we will read "Miss Moo Goes to the Zoo" where we compare zoo animals to farms animals and explore why they live where they do.
- Our next book will concentrate on black & white animals as we discover the different patterns of a panda bear, cow, and zebra.
- Another poem has our class mixing black & white paint to make grey elephants!
- Please remember our morning snack is served by 9:00AM & we start circle time at 9:30AM when children arrive to school late, it impacts our learning time!
- Please be sure to update the clothing you have in your child's cubby to the correct size and season
- Weather permitting, we will be going outside two times per day ~ please have a weatherappropriate jacket, hat, and gloves for your child!
- Lastly, we would love to have zoo pictures from your own trips to the zoo to display in our classroom!

Pre-K & Pre-K 2:

- This month we will be exploring a bunch of winter themes! First we are discussing polar animals like polar bears, penguins, seals, arctic foxes, and more! We learned about how they stay warm, their eating habits, and how they survive in such cold temperatures!
- Next, put your hands together because it's winter sports theme! We will explore different winter sports and even re-enact some!
- Next, we take it back to the core of winter weather as we discuss why it snows, what temperature
 things freeze at, and general winter weather patterns. To go along with this we will also learn
 about clouds this month. We will examine the different types of clouds, make our own clouds, and
 look outside and identify the clouds we see!
- Last but not least, we have personal interview week! This week is all about the kids learning their favorite things, their interests, favorite part of school, and more!

※ Winter Weather Activity Guide **※**

Does the cold weather have you stumped when it comes to planning activities with your young learner? There are ** snow ** many fun ways to make the most of chilly winter weather - check out our guides below for inspiration!

At-Home Activities:

Evergreen Exploration

During autumn, we watched leaves fall off of many trees. But, not all trees have leaves to lose! Evergreen trees (such as pine, spruce, hemlock, and more) offer students a variety of opportunities to connect with nature during the winter months! Bundle up for a nature walk and try out the following activities:

- Search the ground for pinecones and look up in the evergreen trees for pinecones that haven't fallen yet.
- Search for animal homes in deciduous trees.
- Lie down under the evergreens and look up through the branches. Talk about what you see and how evergreens provide shelter from the elements.
- Look for whorls of branches on the conifers. Estimate the age of the tree by counting the whorls.

Below-Zero Bubble Blast!

Bubbles don't need to be a summer-only activity! When the temperature is just right, playing with bubble solution in winter can allow students to explore some pretty *cool* science! If the weather dips below freezing temperatures, put on your warmest winter gear and try these bubble experiments:

- · Have your students blow some bubbles and watch as they crystalize before their eyes.
- If you have a blacktop outside, blow the bubbles there and see them roll around on the ground
 instead of popping. Have the students touch the bubbles and note how they feel. Eventually, the
 bubble solution itself will freeze and you have your students watch as the crystals slowly appear
 across the liquid's surface. This is a great way to talk about the science of freezing and liquids.
- Then, run inside and get warm!

P.S. - If you try these activities, be sure to let the bubble solution chill in the refrigerator for a bit first. These activities work best when the bubbles are cold!

Pinecone Bird Feeder

Learn more about the species that stick around during the winter months from the comfort of indoors by making a pinecone birdfeeder!

- Start by tying a string around a pinecone (maybe one that you found during your evergreen exploration!). Then, mix peanut butter with cornmeal, and oats.
- Use a spoon, or your fingers, to spread the mixture onto the pinecones.
- Finally, pour some birdseed onto a plate and roll the peanut butter covered pinecones in the seed until they are completely covered.
- Hang the pinecone birdfeeders in a tree and watch the birds (and squirrels!) as they visit.

Have your learner watch from the window and take note of which winter critters come to visit. Compare the list of winter animals to those you may see in the warmer months!

Tuition Policy Reminders

With the new year upon us, please take note of the following tuition policies, as per our Tuition Agreement:

• Vacation Credit Policy:

Vacation Credit for tuition is only valid for a Monday-Friday planned absence. Utilization of your vacation credit **requires 2 week advanced written notice** in order for the credit to be approved. **Vacation credits renew on July 1st of each year.**

• Early Withdrawal/Change of Schedule:

Withdrawal from the School during the School Year requires at least four weeks' advance written notice. If Parents desire to enroll student again after withdrawal, space is not guaranteed. Changes to a Student's attendance schedule during the School Year is dependent on availability and requires at least four week's advance written notice to reduce the schedule and two week's advance notice to increase the schedule. Parents' tuition obligations continue through the notice period.

• Holidays/In-Service Days:

Tuition is continuous throughout the School Year (taking into account the days the School is closed). No credit will be given for holidays, professional in-service days, school closures, or Students' absences or illnesses.

• Tuition Due/Late Charges:

Tuition and fee payments are due no later than Mondays by end of day. A late payment fee of \$25 is assessed at noon on Tuesday. Returned checks/ACH are assessed a \$25 service charge. There is a late pick-up fee of \$1 per minute after the scheduled pick up time (this applies to our Modified Hours of Operation as well).

Are you planning on taking a break this summer (such as a vacation or hiatus), and do you intend on having your child return to school with us in the fall? Please notify us via email regarding your summer plans as soon as you can!

Allergy & Medication Updates

During the month of January, we will be doing an audit of all emergency medications kept at-school for children. If your child has any medication stored at school (such as epi-pens, inhalers, etc.) for allergies or other medical conditions, we will be asking you to **sign updated paperwork** to ensure that we can continue to hold & utilize these medications as directed, and we will be **asking for new medications should the current ones be expiring.**

Please remember - we require all medications kept at-school to be provided unopened, in its original box with a prescription label (if applicable).
