Tods:

We have a busy month coming up! It's hard to believe it is already April! Happy Spring!

- 4/3 Our first theme this month will be Chicks! We will be reading the story "Five Little Chicks" by Nancy Tafuri. For art, we will be creating a chick popping out of an egg! This will be made from different shapes of construction paper.
- 4/10 Our second theme for April will be Lady Bugs! We will read the story "The Grouchy Lady Bug" by Eric Carle and make a lady bug out of shapes using construction paper. We are also excited to be receiving bug catching kits. We will be getting magnifying glasses, bug observation containers, and binoculars for the kids to explore bugs and nature outside!
- 4/14 Let get outside! This week we will be celebrating Earth Day! To reinforce the
 importance of our keeping our earth clean, we will be reading the book "How to help the
 Earth by The Lorax" by Tish Rabe. For art, we will be creating a picture of the earth using
 green and blue paint. Keep your eyes out for some ladybugs flying around! We will be
 having a ladybug release sometime at the end of this month!!
- 4/24- The last theme of the month will be Bunnies. We will read the story "Spring Is Here Grumpy Bunny" by Justine Korman. We will create a bunny out of different shapes.

B1:

- Happy April! This month our learning experiences are about all things Spring! 🖁 🌧 🕄 🕏
- Week 1 As winter recedes and Spring sets forth, Bunnies will appear everywhere this
 time of year. This week we will learn about Bunnies and read the book" It's Not Easy Being
 a Bunny by Marilyn Sadler. We will also include music and movement into our routine as
 we learn to tap our feet to the bunny hop dance.
- Week 2 April showers bring May flowers. Bring out those bright raincoats, tiny rainboots and umbrellas as we gear up for a change in season. This week we will learn about rain, clouds and the weather, how it impacts our neighborhoods and slowly turns everything back to green. We will learn to make paper boats and read the book "The Rainy Day" by Anna Milbourne.

- Week 3 With Earth Day approaching on April 23th our little minds are inquisitive to know about planet Earth, the importance of caring for the world and the environment. We will work on a simple paper plate weaving activity and read the book Biscuit's Earth Day Celebration by Alyssa Satin Capucilli.
- Week 4 From Buds to Blossoms, Spring Flowers will be in bloom everywhere. This week
 will learn about flowers, gardening and planting a few seeds and watching them grow. We
 will set up a simple Spring Flower sensory bin and make some observations along the
 way.

B2:

- B2 is excited to hop into a new month!
 - -This month we will dive into science, gross motor skills, weather, and animals.
 - Week 1 Our theme for the week will be 'Bugs and Butterflies' we will read the 'Very Hungry Caterpillar.' Beginners 2 will also work on our gross motor skills by cutting out trails for our very hungry caterpillars. As well as our Days of the Week workbooks.
 - Week 2- Our class will learn about gardening. We will plant beans and emphasize plant words like seed, roots, sprout, stalk, and leaves, as well as science process words like experiment, test, compare, describe, observe, and predict.
 - Week 3- We will read 'In the rain with baby duck' and center crafts around our reading.
 - Week 4- With continuing on with our seasons and weather. We will learn about April showers and the effects rain has on plants.

Intermediates:

- April may bring showers, but for our Intermediate learners it brings birds, bugs, and bunnies!
- We're embracing the National Association for the Education of the Young Child (NAEYC)
 Challenge!
- We'll be exploring Spring's metamorphosis with caterpillars & butterflies, "Rockin Robins" musically, and doing the Bunny Hop!
- We're planting seeds & making bird feeders. Oh, and for a special Earth Day surprise, on
 Friday April 22nd we're letting a dozen butterflies set soar in our community garden!!

Pre-K:

• Welcome April! This month we are getting down to it! The first thing we will be focusing on in Pre-K is money honey! Students will practice identifying all the coins and dollars we use here in the U.S.! We will learn how many of each it takes to create the next, and will even have a mock shopping day! Then we are telling time on the dime! Students will practice reading clocks! We have our own clock to practice on where we will be examining the differences between seconds, minutes, and hours! Then it's all about loving this Earth! We all live here, and we all must take care of our planet! Earth Day is April 22nd, and we will prepare! Students will learn about recycling, the 3 R's, and how much the Earth affects us, and we, it! Lastly this month we are doubling down on our letters and sight words! We will learn the alphabet in order, out of order, and even backwards!! We will practice our common sight words and manner sight words! In Pre-K we are even playing scrabble!! We will use scrabble blocks to spell our names, and put the alphabet in order. Lastly we are labeling everything in our room! Yay Pre-K!

Pre-K 2:

I can't believe it's April already, this school year is going by so fast!

This month we're getting down to the nitty gritty! We will be working on getting our skills down. We will also learn all about earth day and easter!
 We will first start off with our math skills. We start off with number recognition and number matching games. We will then work on some simple addition and subtraction problems. Then we will work on grouping and understanding what it means for numbers to be, greater than, less than, and equal to.

We will then work on our letters and writing skills. We will work on letter recognition and letter sounds. We will also do matching games to help better understand which is an uppercase letter and which is a lowercase letter. We will then practice writing letters on our own and tracing them. We will also work on writing our names in the proper case. We will then work on our reading skills. We will review some of the sight words we learned and practice sounding out words. We will go over what features identify a book and what makes a book a book. Then we'll learn about what word families are and make sentences using the sight words we learned!

I will also be sending out homework each week to help these skills grow stronger! April here we come!

Vacation Credit & Hiatus Reminders

Summer will be here before you know it! Let us know if you are planning on using your vacation credit. Please remember:

- Vacation credits require two weeks' written notice in order to be utilized
- Credits reset on July 1st.

If you are taking a hiatus for the summer, please note:

- We require a 30-day (4 week) notice for a hiatus date
- We will require a specified return date before we can place your child on hiatus in order to maintain their spot on our roster.

Cubby Clothes Reminders

As the weather is warming up, remember to change out your child's spare cubby clothes accordingly! As a reminder, we recommend all children have extras of the following clothing items in their cubbies:

Also, with summer just around the corner, we want to remind all families that **open-toed shoes are not permitted at school**. Close-toed sandals, sneakers, and other footwear are recommended for summer shoe usage!

Clothing Donations

If you are doing some spring cleaning, we are taking donations! We can always use extra sets of clothes here at school. In particular, we are in need of clothing - pants especially - size **4T** or larger!

Pickett Post, Construction, & Parking Etiquette

Pickett Post has informed us that the new tennis court should be installed at some point within the next 4-6 weeks! We will also be partnering with them to have our parking lot seal-coated. This project will likely take place during a weekend, but with all of this construction in mind, we felt that now was a good time to provide a reminder of our parking lot etiquette guidelines!

We understand that our parking lot is small and can become very busy. With this being said, engaging in a community culture of respect is of the upmost importance here at our school. Please remember the following when entering and exiting the parking lots:

- Please watch your speed & take turns slowly
- You should enter the parking lot and follow the right side of the traffic circle to find your spot & follow the same path to exit
- Remember to double check all blind spots and rear-view mirror for little ones as they are tiny but quick!
- Please remember to hold your child(ren)'s hands and help them practice safe choices as well (stop, look both ways, etc.)
- Please **avoid parking in front of the dumpster**s and/or in designated Pickett Post parking spaces.
- Please remember to be courteous of doors when taking time to buckle your little ones in
- . Always turn your car off while you are in the building with your child
- And most importantly, please be respectful and communicate with others in a productive manner

We understand that everyone is busy and that it can be tough during crowded moments, but please take your time, be respectful, be helpful, and reach out as always with any questions or suggestions.

Sunscreen & Water Bottles!

With the weather warming up, we want to be totally prepared! Here are some quick reminders about sunscreen and water bottles during the warm weather months:

Sunscreen:

- Please provide at least one bottle of unopened, unexpired, liquid or stick sunscreen to be kept at school for your child to utilize during the spring/summer.
- Sunscreen sprays are not permitted.
- Sunscreen must be applied **at home** before school in the mornings. Teachers will re-apply sunscreen to students in the afternoon.

Water Bottles:

- You may provide a reusable water bottle for your child to bring outside during trips to the playground.
- Plastic, single-use water bottles are not permitted.
- All water bottles must be labeled clearly with your child's name.

Toys from Home

As a friendly reminder, we typically ask that all families **refrain from sending toys from home to school.** Students are permitted to have **one soft toy** to utilized at **naptime only**, and otherwise be kept in their cubby. Toys or other objects from home such as action figures, cars, trains, books etc. are not permitted, as they can be lost/broken/cause classroom disagreement.




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
