# **Fall Highlights**

## **Community Connects**

Through various community partnerships, our students have had the opportunity to participate in authentic, real-world experiences, making connections that will ignite passions, extend their learning, and prepare them for the future.

3rd Grade students partnered with **Bringing Hope Home**, a local organization bringing unexpected amazingness to families dealing with cancer. Through their Parade of Pumpkins fundraiser, 3rd grade was able to donate \$3,000 to help a child named Kaden. In addition to the fundraiser, students volunteered at BHH Headquarters, making cards for BHH families.

Kindergarten students collected Halloween candy, self-care items and non-perishable food for **Stockings for Soldiers**. Along with the support of our school community, Kindergarten students were able to collect 151 pounds, or 4,087 pieces of candy for our troops!

Across all grade levels, CBA Elementary students lent a hand in our garden. With the help of the **Chester County Food Bank** students learned best practices for planting, growing, and harvesting. We donated over 50 pounds of vegetables this season including kale, carrots, potatoes, peppers, eggplant, tomatoes, squash and more!

We see the difference our time and effort make...whether it's raising funds or donating items to organizations that serve those suffering from food insecurity or homelessness or giving the gift of time to our community members and brightening their day with caring smiles.

By providing these opportunities for our students, they develop an appreciation for what they have, show gratitude towards others, and see the positive impact of their actions even at a young age. They feel good about giving back to others and want to continue spreading joy time and time again.

## **Experiential Learning**

Real-world experiences provide students with opportunities to acquire deeper knowledge and skills on the concepts they are learning in the classroom. Field Trips allow students to engage

in practical activities, and opportunities to reflect on their experiences to deepen understanding and begin to apply concepts in authentic settings.

This fall we have visited local community attractions and educational venues including **Highland Orchard, The Chester County History Center, The PA State Capitol Building, Paradise Farms and Brandywine Red Clay Alliance**. We explored our government, animal adaptations, past and present, and engaged in team building activities to strengthen our classroom communities.

4th and 5th Grade students and their families traveled to **Williamsburg, VA** for a 3-day overnight trip and historical tour. The itinerary included Historic Jamestown, Colonial Williamsburg, and Yorktown American Revolution Museum. Students were able to see a glassblowing demonstration, visited a re-created 1607 Jamestown settlement, entered the Governor's Palace, and explored the Colonial Army Encampment. Staying overnight at Great Wolf Lodge was the icing on the cake!

## **Professional Development and Student Ambassadors**

Spring Education Group leaders from along the East Coast visited our campus in late October for a 2-day leader training. Leaders from North Carolina and Florida engaged in student-led Apple Playgrounds to learn more about what it means to be an Apple Distinguished School. Our students were true stars, leaving the leaders absolutely blown away at how adept they are at showcasing their learning through the iPad.

## **Communities of Belonging**

CBA Elementary takes great pride in creating a community of belonging. Our focus is on organizing events and activities that celebrate the diverse cultural backgrounds of our students and staff within the school community. We hope to promote an inclusive environment where everyone feels valued and respected.
