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## 30 Years of Education ~ Wise words from Ms. Jen

Ms. Jen has been part of the Chesterbrook Academy family for 30 years, 30 years of lessons, 30 years of laughter, and 30 years of love.



Since joining Chesterbrook on March 18, 1996, Ms. Jen has witnessed incredible growth, both in our schools and in the children she's taught. She began her journey at our Royersford school when it had just five children enrolled. Over the next 20 years there, she taught in the toddler room, moved through Beginners and Intermediates, and eventually finished her time there in Pre-K.

When asked to describe herself, Ms. Jen shared five words: *reliable, evolving, passionate, creative, and an effective communicator*. Over three decades, she has seen many changes, from handwritten daily sheets with no pictures to today's Tadpoles app, and from minimal curriculum to our in-depth Links to Learning program. Through it all, one thing has remained constant: her commitment to hands-on learning. In Beginner 2, she believes children learn best by playing together, creating their own art, exploring new materials, and discovering the world around them, especially at her Four Seasons sensory table.

What has kept her at Chesterbrook for 30 years? Simply put she loves what she does. She treasures those "ah-ha" moments when a child masters a new skill or reaches a milestone. She also cherishes the relationships built over time, including the incredible experience of teaching former students' children and even welcoming past students back as fellow educators.

Ms. Jen knew she wanted to be a teacher as early as second grade, inspired by her own teacher, Mr. Stauffen, who was kind, patient, and engaging.

Her advice to new teachers? "Enjoy the little moments, because they turn into the big moments in life. Everything will eventually work out, we need to make mistakes to learn."

And perhaps the lesson that has stayed with her the most: there are no bad days just rough moments. And those rough moments are often the ones that teach us the most.



A reminder of the importance of water conservation and protecting our planet's natural resources.



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## Staff Professional Development: Survival to Safety™

We were pleased to welcome Stephanie Reilly, founder of **Bright Awakened Inc.** and a former parent in our school community, to lead our educators through **Survival to Safety™**, a brain-based professional development experience focused on emotional regulation and early childhood development.

This training deepened our teachers' understanding of how young children's brains process stress and emotion, and how supportive adult relationships strengthen a child's ability to learn, connect, and thrive.

Educators explored practical, heart-centered breathing strategies and developmentally appropriate regulation tools that can be woven naturally into the classroom day. The training combines neuroscience-informed insight with heart-centered, imagination-supported regulation tools. Families may begin to notice small shifts - children talking about taking a calming heart breath, using simple language around feelings, or practicing strategies that help their bodies settle.

For families interested in learning more, **Bright Awakened Coaching** also offers individual kid/parent coaching and kid workshops focused on building calm, confidence, and connection from the inside out.

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## Important School Reminders

### Weather Policy for Outdoor Time

In line with **PA licensing standards**, we take our students outside **twice daily** for gross motor play, as long as the following conditions are met:

- **Wind chill is above 25°F**
- **Temperature is below 90°F or the real feel is below 93°F**
- **No active precipitation**
- **No air quality alert**



**Please dress your child in weather-appropriate clothing** each day so they're ready for fun, no matter the forecast!

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### Safety reminders at CBA

As we move into the busy fall season, we want to share a few quick reminders to keep our school community safe during pick-up and drop-off:

#### Parking Lot Tips:

- Enter through the bottom lot and use the second entrance.
- Follow the right side of the traffic circle to find your parking spot and exit the same way.
- Drive slowly, stay aware, and watch for our little ones—they can be quick!

#### Child Safety Tips:

- Always hold your child's hand and practice safe habits like stopping and looking both ways.
- Never leave a child unattended in the car.
- Be mindful of others when buckling in or getting settled.
- Turn off your car when entering the building, and avoid idling whenever possible to help keep our air clean.
- **To ensure the safety of all students, a parent, guardian, or approved adult is required to accompany children to and from their classroom at drop-off and pick-up.**

We're so thankful for our amazing CBA families and everything you do to make our school safe, welcoming, and full of smiles every day!

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## Parking Lot: Idling Reminder

As a reminder, **IDLING IS NOT ALLOWED IN OUR LOT**. We request that families ensure all approved pickup persons - grandparents, nannies, babysitters, or any other family or caregivers - are all aware of the rules surrounding idling in our parking lot.

Science says that idling cars is not only bad for the environment as a whole, but **it creates local hot spots of pollution** that our children then must walk through and breathe! Air pollution caused by vehicle exhaust can aggravate asthma, allergies, and cardiovascular and respiratory disease.

**Children are especially sensitive to air pollution** because they breathe 50% more air per pound of body weight than adults!

Please do your part to keep our kids safe and healthy by following our parking lot guidelines!

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## Drop-Off & Pick-Up Reminders

As a reminder to all of our families, new and old, our CBA Drop-off and Pick-Up times are as follows:

- **Morning Drop-Off: Between 7AM-9AM.**

You can drop your child off directly in their classroom. If you are going to be late, please send us a message via Tadpoles. Please note that consistently late drop-offs impact your child's routine as well as the classroom's routine.

- *Please note: our school is not open for operation prior to 7AM.*

- **Half-Day Pick-Up: Between 12:30PM-1PM.**

Come right to your child's classroom for pickup!

- **Full-Day Pick-Up: Between 3PM-6PM.**

Come right to your child's classroom for pickup. Please be mindful that our center closes at 6PM sharp!

*A late fee will apply to students and families who are in the building after 6PM.*

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## Vacation Credit, Hiatus, and Withdrawal Reminders

Please see below for the following reminders regarding vacation credit, hiatus, & withdrawals. Take special note of our policies around *withdrawal dates & vacation credit eligibility*.

### Vacation Credits:

- Vacation credits require **two weeks' written notice via email** in order to be utilized.
- Credits reset on July 1st.
- Credits can only be utilized for a Monday-Friday absence. If a child is present for any portion of the week, regular tuition will apply.
- New students must be **enrolled for 6 months** to be eligible for a vacation credit.
- Students who have taken **a recent hiatus** will need to wait **6 months** to be eligible for a vacation credit.
- Vacation credits do not "carry over" from year to year.
- You are **not eligible** for a vacation credit **if you are within 30 days of your withdrawal date.**

### Hiatus:

- We require a 30-day (4 week) written notice via email for a hiatus date.
- A hiatus must be a minimum of three weeks long.
- You must commit to a **return date** before we can place your child on hiatus in order to maintain their spot on our roster.
- Families returning from hiatus must pay an \$80 re-registration fee (plus \$55 for siblings).
- Families who have notified us of a hiatus date are *no longer eligible for a vacation credit.*  
Students returning from hiatus *are not eligible for a vacation credit until they have been back at school for 6 months.*

### Withdrawals:

- Withdrawals require a **30-day (4 week) written notice via email** in order for your enrollment deposit to be credited towards your final week's tuition.
- Families who are within 30 days of their withdrawal date are *no longer eligible for to utilize a vacation credit.*

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## Ensure Your Child Has Spare Cubby Clothes!

As Spring's fluctuating temperature and weather starts, please remember to replace clothing with weather-appropriate items. We recommend that all children have extras of the following in their cubbies:

- Shirts (long sleeve & short sleeve)
- Pants
- Underwear
- Socks
- Shoes

Please make sure your child brings a **jacket every day**, as it will remain on the chilly side.

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## Labels: Water Bottles, Blankets, Clothes, etc.

As a reminder, it is essential that **all of your child's belongings** are labeled clearly with their first and last name. This includes (but is not limited to):

- Reusable water bottles
- Spare cubby clothes
- Naptime supplies (blankets, sheets, nappers, soft toys)
- Bottles
- Food containers
- Backpacks

*Chesterbrook Academy is not responsible for any items that may become lost or missing during the school day.*

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## Illness Policy Reminder

At Chesterbrook Academy, the health and safety of our school community is always a top priority. As we enter the colder months, illnesses like colds, flu, and stomach viruses can circulate more easily.

We ask that families partner with us by keeping sick children at home. Doing so helps us:

- Minimize the spread of illness to other children and staff
- Support the full recovery of the sick child
- Reduce the circulation of contagious conditions during cold and flu season

To protect our school community, any individual, child or adult who is visibly ill will be asked to remain at home. Children who become sick during the school day will be made comfortable, and families will be required to pick them up within **one hour** of notification.

**Children must remain home and be symptom-free for a minimum of 24 hours without the aid of medication** before returning to school if they experience any of the following symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4°F or higher
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Heavy nasal discharge requiring wiping every 3–5 minutes
- Persistent, non-productive or “barking” cough
- Sore throat
- Noticeable irritability, fussiness, or crankiness outside of typical behavior
- Skin rashes, including diaper rashes
- Head lice
- Any symptoms of a communicable disease such as pink eye, strep throat, chickenpox, measles, or mumps

## Seasonal Safety Reminder:

As the colder months continue, hand washing becomes even more important! Please encourage your little ones to wash hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes, and practice other healthy habits to help reduce the spread of germs.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us uphold these standards to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment for everyone.

Chesterbrook Academy reserves the right to refuse admittance to any child or individual showing signs of illness.

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## Classroom Happenings

### Infants

## Beginner 1

Happy March!! We welcome March with a renewed sense of excitement as we dive into new topics and themes this month.

Week 1: Its "Read Across America Week", the largest annual literacy celebration encouraging young learners to read as we celebrate Dr Seuss's birthday. We will focus on Language and Literacy skills and learning outcomes by reading a variety of Dr Seuss's books everyday and incorporating tracing activities this week. We will practice rhyming words from his books and engage in short discussions inspired by his whimsical world.

## Beginner 2


